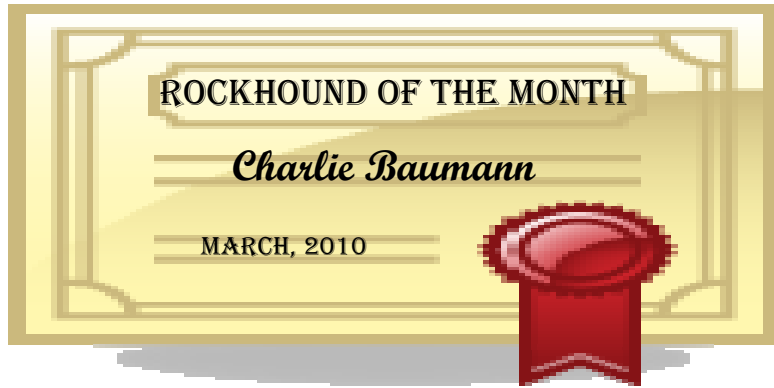

ful patterns within the quartz. Jim Lutfy presented some examples of Polyhedroid Quartz. Polyhedroid Quartz are very rare and are no longer found in the wild. They were originally found in one small spot of "red soil" in Brazil. About 200 kilos were removed and sent to Australia, where they were distributed to collectors. The Polyhedroid Quartz are sharply angular. When cut and polished – a most beautiful display! Polyhedroid Quartz are only available from collectors, and therefore quite expensive. Jim donated a very detailed paper regarding Polyhedroid Quartz to the Rockhounds library. Both presentations were very entertaining and informative. Thanks, Sis and Jim.
