Common Metamorphic Rocks. From your previous classes about igneous and sedimentary rocks, you have developed a basic understanding of the rock cycle. This class will cover the last major rock type. Metamorphic rocks can form from either of the other two types (as well as from older metamorphic rocks), and so they have a wide variety of mineral compositions and textures. This group includes such useful materials as marble, slate, and the source rocks for several valuable minerals (including garnet, talc, and corundum).
