To continue with common theme color for Rocks each month of the year, inspired by seasonal themes and traditional associations. These colors can help highlight different rocks and minerals that match each month's theme.

November, **Bring in your favorite rock to the meeting that is Brown or Amber colored**. Brown and amber are perfect colors for November, reflecting the natural transition from autumn to winter. These colors not only reflect the natural world but also bring a sense of warmth and nostalgia, making them perfect for November.

Brown Rocks

- 1. **Tiger's Eye**: This is a beautiful, chatoyant gemstone that displays a silky luster and a rich, golden-brown color. It's often used in jewelry and is believed to bring good luck and protection.
- 2. **Smoky Quartz**: This variety of quartz ranges from light brown to nearly black. It's known for its clarity and is often used in decorative pieces and jewelry.
- 3. **Petrified Wood**: This is fossilized wood that has turned to stone over millions of years. It often has a brown color and can show beautiful patterns that resemble the original wood grain.

Amber Rocks

 Amber: This is fossilized tree resin that can range in color from pale yellow to deep orange and brown. It's often used in jewelry and can contain ancient inclusions like insects or plant material.

- 2. **Citrine:** While typically yellow, some citrine can have a warm, amber-like hue. It's a popular gemstone for jewelry and is known for its bright, sunny color.
